

COURSES OFFERED DURING THE FALL AND SPRING HWS FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS

The HWS Faculty-led program includes a faculty-led course component, which offer one or two courses on art, architecture, sculpture, anthropology, tourism, imaging or travel-writing. The courses vary every semester based on the faculty that leads the program.

Another component of the program are the food related and design oriented courses provided by GLI, such as the Foodways and Foodscapes course where the students examine the connection between food and identities, design and communities. Students work on projects, and they research and design sustainable urban landscapes.

Students also take an Italian language and culture course, which build upon the foundation of Italian language study completed at HWS prior to the program. A variety of visits to local sites complement in-class instruction and a series of "labs" introduces students to various aspects of Italian culture and society. Students with more advanced Italian skills are placed in an upper-level class.

Courses are accompanied by visits in Rome that range from the popular Colosseum and Roman Forum to lesser-known neighborhoods in Rome where daily Roman life can be observed, where people meet and identities are revealed such as markets in Piazza Vittorio, Monti and in the Testaccio neighborhood.

Students also have the opportunity to travel outside of Rome to visit farms, food producers, experts as well as archeological and art sites located in the Lazio, Tuscany, Veneto, Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Campania, Calabria and Sicily regions.
