



### **INT 101 Academic Internship (Onsite)**

# **Research Project Briefing**

The student will work with the Learning Facilitator and Academic Supervisor to develop a line of research regarding their internship expectations and goals, to enrich the internship placement. These may include:

- visits
- · meetings with experts
- readings

Students will work on a specific project in the sector to which they are assigned. Objectives, expectations and expected results for the project (advertising campaign, research project, educational plan for schools, a design for a new product, a comparison between USA and Italy, etc.) will be designed taking into consideration the intern's academic interests and the social, ethical, business or sustainability challenges facing the field site. In some cases, this project can be a continuation of work students have done on their home campuses.

#### DEADLINES:

- Project Proposal Due. 500 words max, emailed to your Internship Facilitator by 18:00 on 2 Feb
- Project Outline Due. emailed to your Internship Facilitator by 18:00 on 16 Feb
- Research Project Status Check: 14 March 12:00 in meetings with Internship Facilitator
- Work Experience Analysis Due. 12 April

Projects culminate in a **Final Symposium** which includes a multimedia presentation. All internship students and representatives from all internship sites as well as other faculty and guests will be invited to participate.

#### - Final Symposium Presentation on 2 May at 17:00 .

Students submit a Research Paper documenting the results of their assigned research project.

- Research Paper Due at time of symposium

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# **Journal Assignment Briefing**

Students should keep a daily record of their thoughts and observations using blogs or social media tools. The medium you choose is up to you. It may also be a simple paper journal. However you choose to keep it, you will be expected to share it with your supervisors and with a limited public so write with readers in mind.

The journal will be reviewed approximately every month during the course.

DEADLINES:

- 1st Journal Review at 18:00 on Thursday 9 February
- 2nd Journal Review at 18:00 on Thursday 16 March
- 3rd Journal Review at 18:00 on Thursday 6 April
- Final Journal Review at 18:00 on Thursday 27 April

The final journal will be submitted for evaluation on **27 April**. It will be graded for consistency, creativity, content, accuracy, and interest.

## **Video Interview Briefing**

Students conduct a **video interview** of the internship placement supervisor or another person involved in the placement (conducted in English). This should last about 3-5 minutes and be carefully produced with titles, clear audio, music and credits.

- Video Subject Due on 16 Feb
- Video Interview Questions Due: emailed to your Internship Facilitator by 2 March
- Video Rough-cut Due: 29 March
- Video Interview Final Cut Due: 20 April
